



Chevron Border

Materials

Borders on two sides

- $\frac{5}{8}$ yard each for inner and outer chevron (or 1- $\frac{1}{4}$ yards total)
- $\frac{5}{8}$ yard for binding (or 318" total length)
- 5- $\frac{1}{8}$ yards backing
- 74" x 91" batting

Borders on four side

- 1- $\frac{1}{8}$ yards inner chevron
- 1- $\frac{3}{8}$ yards outer chevron and corners
- $\frac{5}{8}$ yard for binding (or 376" total length)
- 5- $\frac{1}{3}$ yards backing
- 91" square batting

Read through all instructions before beginning. Remove selvages. Cut pieces exactly as listed in instructions. Sew pieces right sides together and use an accurate $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



Chevron Boarder on Two Sides

Finished Size: 68" x 85"

•From each of the inner and outer chevron fabrics, cut:

- » Two 9- $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips then cut into eight 9- $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

•From the binding fabric, cut:

- » Eight 2- $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips



Chevron Border on Four Sides

Finished Size: 85" square

•From the inner chevron, cut:

» Four 9-½" x 42" strips then cut into sixteen 9-½" squares

•From the outer chevron and corners, cut:

» Four 9-½" x 42" strips then cut into sixteen 9-½" squares

» One 9" x 42" strips then cut into four 9" corner squares

•From the binding fabric, cut:

» Nine 2-¼" x 42" strips

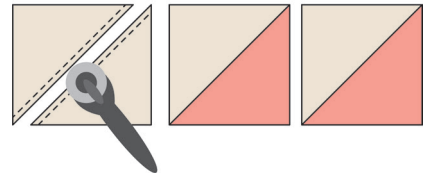
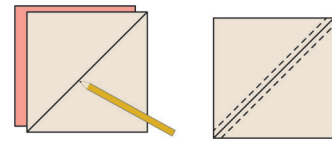
Make the Borders

The border is made using half-square triangles (HSTs). Depending upon how many borders you plan to add to your sampler will determine how many HST you will need to make. Simple 9" squares are added to the corners of the four-sided boarder quilt instead of HSTs.

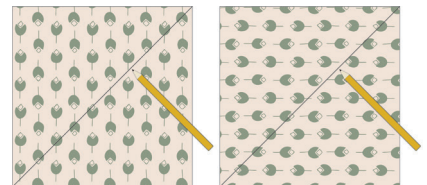
Half-Square Triangle Units

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each 9-½" inner chevron square*. Place a marked square right sides together with a same-size outer chevron

square. Sew a ¼" seam allowance on each side of the line. Cut apart on the line to make two HST units. Trim units to 9" square.



*If working with directional prints, divide the directional prints in half, with half the prints running vertically and the other half running horizontally



Make a total of 16 HST units for a two border quilt.

Make a total of 32 HST units for a four border quilt.
