

# #20 IRISH CHAIN VARIATION




### Material List

- · (16) 2-1/2" squares and (8) 1-1/2" squares fabric A
- (5)  $2-\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and (8) 1-1/2" squares fabric B
- (2) 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips and (2)  $1-\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10-\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for frames

Read through all instructions before beginning. Remove selvages. Sew pieces right sides together and use a 1/4" seam throughout unless otherwise stated.


Four Patch Units Noting placement, sew (2) 1-1/2" fabric A squares to (2) 1-1/2" fabric B squares, alternating paired squares as shown into 2 rows of 2 squares each. Join rows to make a Four Patch unit. Make a total of 4 Four Patch units.



# Block Assembly

- 1. Referring to the Block Assembly Diagram, and noting orientation, sew (3) 2-1/2" fabric A squares between 2 Four Patch units to make row A. Make a total of 2 A rows.
- 2. Sew (2) 2-1/2" fabric B squares alternately between (3) 2-1/2" fabric A squares to make row B. Make a total of 2 B rows.
- 3. Sew (1) 2-½" fabric B square between (4) 2-1/2" fabric A squares to make row C. Join the rows to make the block.
- 4. Stitch the (2) 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" framing strips to opposite sides of

the block. Stitch the (2) 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" framing strips to the remaining sides of the block.
